Yes, if Sweden takes action against the inequality that is due to the income differences that has increased since 1990.

In order to achieve equality by 2030, Sweden must work actively with **target 1.2** of the 2030 Agenda, and reduce the proportion of people of all genders and ages living in any form of poverty.



Yes, if Sweden takes action against the health gaps. Today there are significant differences in health between different social groups.

In order to achieve equality by 2030, Sweden must work actively with **target 3.8** of the 2030 Agenda, ensuring equal medical care, and access to public healthcare of good quality, for all.



Yes, if Sweden continues the work to create equal economic conditions for all municipalities and county councils to provide equal service. Today, inequalities exist between municipalities' resources, which affect the ability to meet people's needs.

In order to achieve equality by 2030, Sweden must work actively with **target 10.4** of the 2030 Agenda, which deals with adopting policies that lead to increased equality.

GET INVOLVED

Support the policies that promote social and economic integration in the society.

Get involved in an organization which works in various ways with efforts to reduce poverty and inequality.

GET INVOLVED

Encourage decision makers to adopt laws that increase access to equal medical care for all.

Know your rights. By being aware of the rights you are entitled to, you can require them to be met, and point out where there are deficiencies that must be addressed.

GET INVOLVED

In order to achieve equality by 2030, Sweden has to work actively with **targets 4.1 and 4.5** of the 2030 Agenda, which aims to ensure that all students, regardless of gender, disabilities, origin and living conditions, complete free and equal, high quality, primary and secondary education.

Yes, if Sweden takes action against inequalities in the school system and works for more equal opportunities in all schools.



Yes, if Sweden continues to work for a democratic, peaceful and inclusive society. Today, for example, there is not an explicit ban on racist organizations, as required by the UN International Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination.

In order to achieve equality by 2030, Sweden must work actively with **targets 16.1 and 16.3** of the 2030 Agenda, which deals with significantly reducing all forms of violence everywhere, promoting the rule of law and ensuring equal access to justice for all.

GET INVOLVED

What is it like in your school? Is it an environment that includes and treats everyone fairly? If so, pay attention to why it's so important to keep up the good work. If not, raise the challenges and what needs to be improved.

Encourage your municipality to offer and build housing for all.

GET INVOLVED

Raise your voice against all types of discrimination that you notice in your school or in your municipality.

Keep yourself informed and up to date about your statutory rights in your working life. Make your voice heard if you witness inequality at your workplace.

GET INVOLVED

To achieve equality by 2030, Sweden must work actively with **target 8.5** of the 2030 Agenda, achieving full and productive employment and decent work for all, and equal pay for equal work.

Yes, if Sweden takes action against the inequalities in the labor market and in working life. Today, the labor market gaps are increasing and the risk of long-term unemployment is high in some groups in the society.



In order to achieve equality by 2030, Sweden must work actively with **target 11.1** of the 2030 Agenda, which aims at ensuring that all people have access to adequate, safe and affordable housing.

Yes, if Sweden takes action against the housing segregation and housing shortages. Today there is a significant housing segregation in the cities and there is a housing shortage in all parts of the country.



Yes, if Sweden counteracts discrimination against people based on gender, skin color, national or ethnic origin, linguistic or religious affiliation, disabilities, sexual orientation and age.

Sweden must work actively with **target 10.3** of the 2030 Agenda, which deals with ensuring equal opportunities through e.g. eliminating discriminatory laws, policies and practices and promoting appropriate laws, policies and action in this regard.
